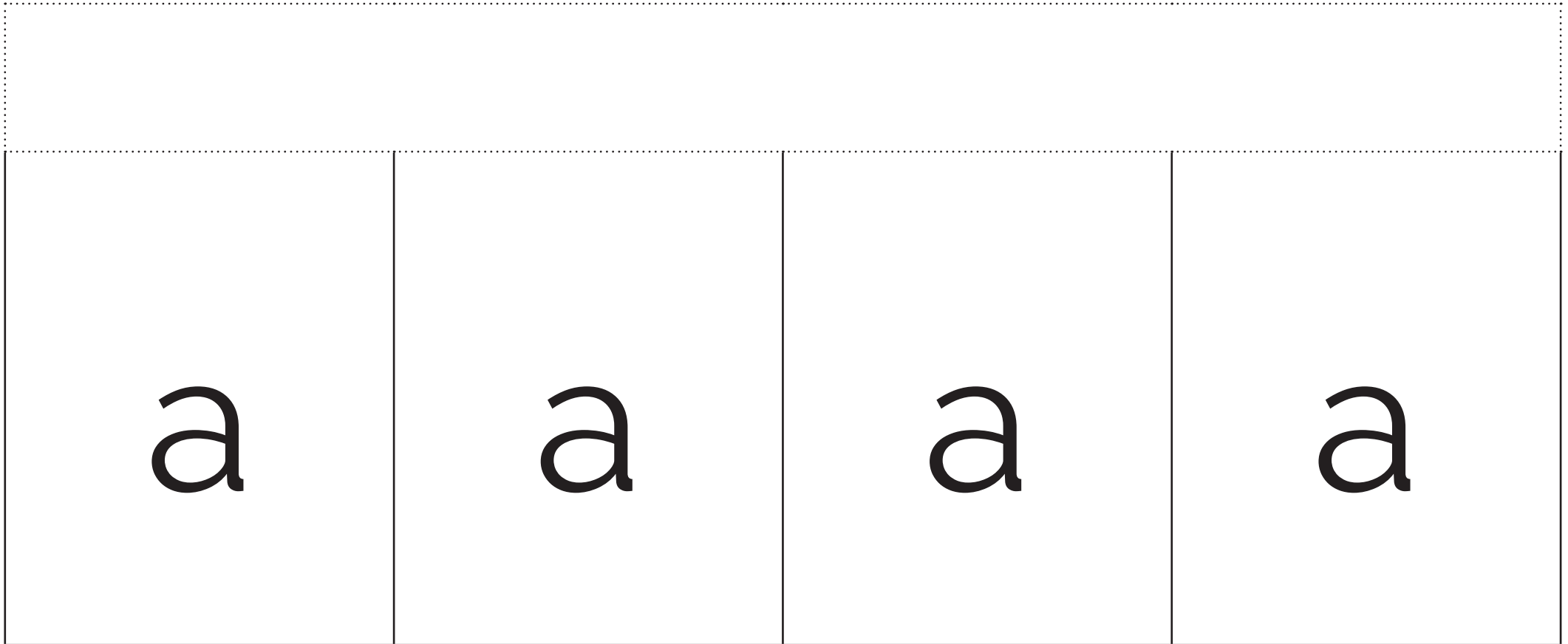




You have 26 pages of letters. Follow the instructions for cutting and binding below.
You will then have a flip book containing 4 x 26 pages (each letter of the alphabet is available for each letter, so you can create unlimited four letter words.)



Cut along these solid lines, stopping when you get to the dotted line.
This will allow you to bind it as one book, without it falling apart. Bind the top inside the dotted rectangle - then you can cut between the letters all the way to the top, so you are able to flip the letters.



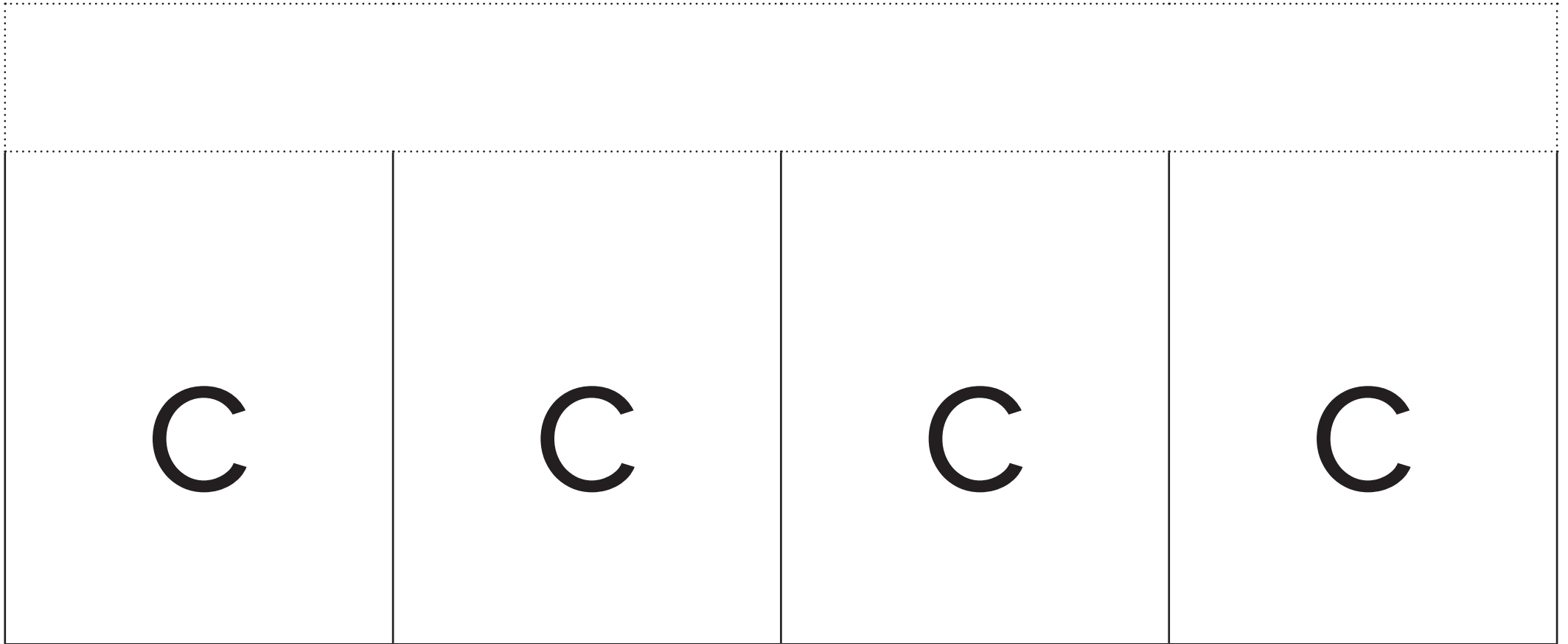

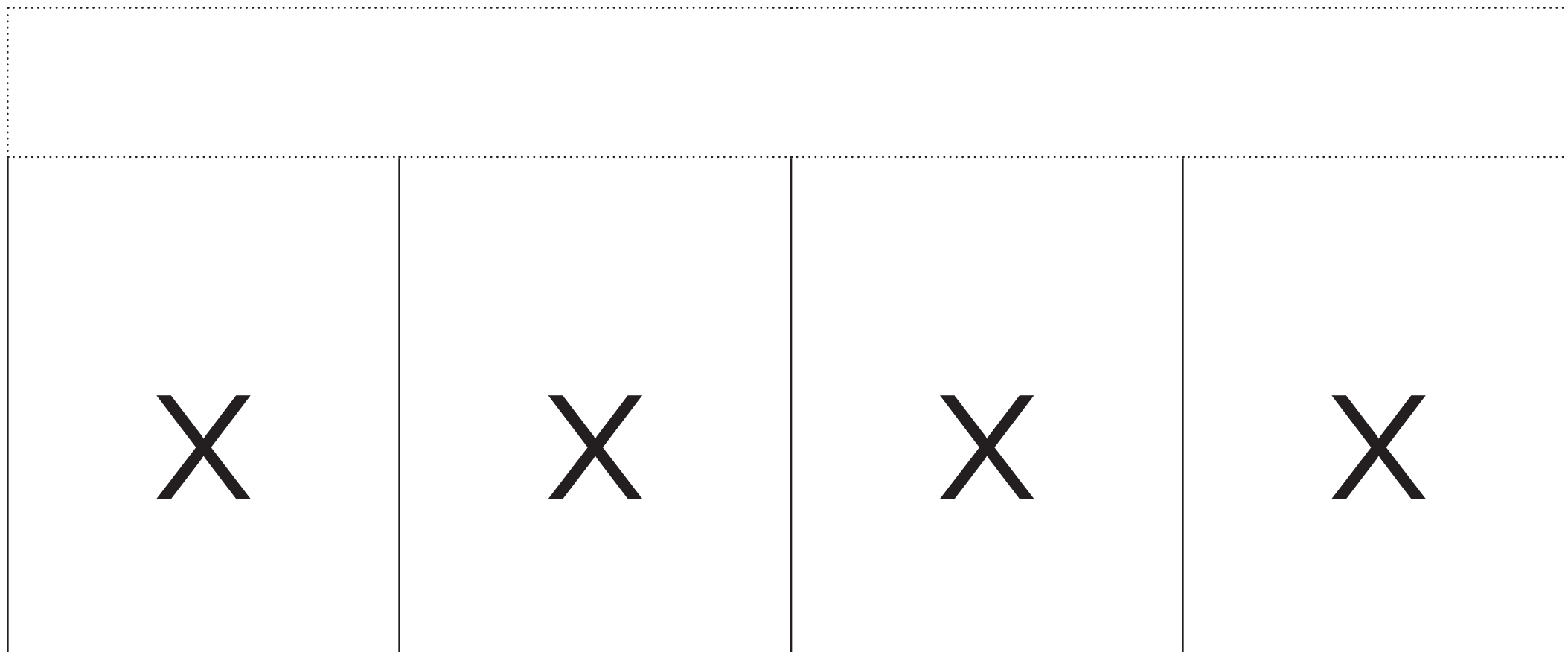
